2ND & 4TH SATURDAY HOLIDAYS – NEED TO REALISE THE BENEFIT

The holidays on 2nd and 4th Saturdays have been achieved after a very hard bargain, long struggles, and sacrifices. This has been possible because of the efforts of all our comrades across the country. The Chairman, CEO's and the Management of All the Banks, the RBI, the IBA and the Government has also put in great efforts in clinching the issue and have accorded their approval for the same.

2. The introduction of this concept of a "week end" implies acceptance of the fact that officers and employees need rest and recuperation after putting in five days of hard work, so as to get rejuvenated to face the pressures of work in the coming week. hard during the five days. Devote the week day's fully to the Bank which is our bread and butter. No compromise on that. But at the same time enjoy your holidays and give it to yourself, your family and society. Any work can wait till the rejuvenated officer comes back with greater energy and vigour. It is myth that working on holidays and Sundays is a symbol of efficiency and duty consciousness.

4. Having said this, we are fully aware of the pressures exerted by the bosses and superiors who have been demanding that all should work on all days. Pressures life write off's NPA recovery, annual closing; quarterly/half yearly closing, Jandhan, Insurance Schemes, Govt. Schemes, De-duplication etc, etc., etc., will be there throughout the year, year after year till an officer falls sick.

5. We therefore request all the officers to fully enjoy their holidays for better physical and mental health and for the family, except in extreme emergencies, when we volunteer to come and work.
