### <u>COVID19 – PERMITTING CONTINUATION OF LEASE ACCOMMODATION/BANK QUARTERS</u> FACILITY TO RETIREE OFFICERS FOR AN ADDITIONAL 3 MONTHS

We wish to draw your kind attention to the extant dispensation on continuation of Lease Accommodation/ Bank Quarters facility which permits retired officers retention of Lease House Accommodation/Bank's quarters up to two months, post-retirement, to enable the officers to relocate to their desired place of settlement comfortably.

2. In the present circumstances of pandemic-COVID19, the activities in the society has become stand-still. Government has restrained people to stay indoors, and all activities, including transportation and labour is absent. Curfew has been imposed in some states. State / District borders have been sealed. Many states have even advised landlords against forced-eviction of tenants also. This restricts the availability of houses also and movement from the existing house/quarters.

3. Under these circumstances, our officers who have retired recently and are retiring in next two-three months are likely to face the hardship in securing house (in case of rented house) or to move to their own place of residence in the absence of transport facilities/labour etc. As such, it would be a humane act to permit such officers an extension of time of further three months more to continue at their present place of stay (Leased accommodation/Bank's Quarter).
