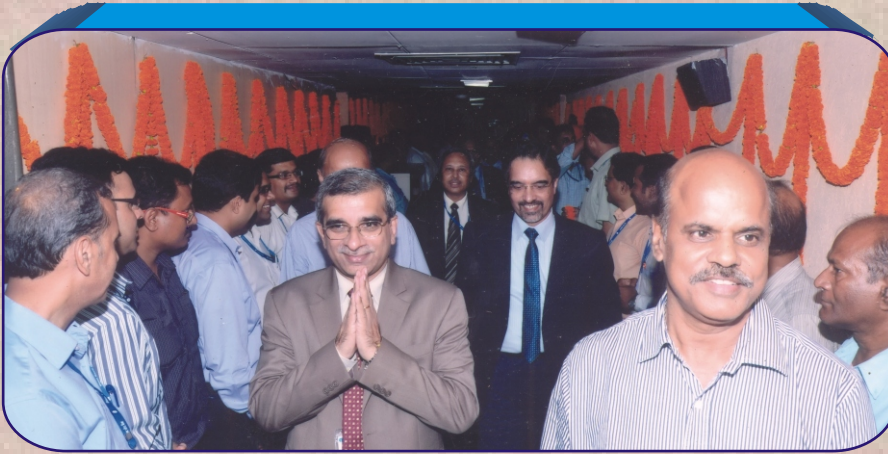

सम्पादक के कलम से



प्रिय साथियों,

आप सभी को एवं आपके परिवारजनों को त्यौहारों के इस मौसम में हार्दिक शुभकामनायें। ईश्वर करें आपका आनेवाला समय सुख एवं शांति से बीते।

संघ के स्तर पर पिछले दो महीने गतिविधियों से परिपूर्ण रहे। दोनों ही नेटवर्कों में Network Negotiating Council की बैठकें हुईं जिनमें नेटवर्क प्रमुख भी उपस्थित रहे। नेटवर्कों से संबंधित कई विषयों पर उन बैठकों के दौरान विस्तार से चर्चा हुई और कार्य बिन्दु निर्णित किये गये। आशा है उन कार्यबिन्दुओं पर कार्य करके सदस्यों का हित सधेगा।

पिछले दिनों सदस्यों के हित में और भी निर्णय हुए जिनके द्वारा कई प्रकार के देय भत्तों में वृद्धि हुई। अब जबकि हमारी केन्द्रीय समिति को लगभग दो वर्ष हो चुके हैं एक ईमानदार आकलन से हमारे सदस्यों को यह अवश्य भरोसा हो जायेगा कि इन दो वर्षों में समिति ने सदस्यों के हित में अनेक निर्णय करवाये हैं। इसके बावजूद आजकल संघ में एक तथाकथित विचारवान समूह की सक्रियता अचानक बढ़ गई है। संघ को आधिकारिक स्तर पर भेजे गये संवादों एवं सूचनाओं को ही अपने नाम से पुनः प्रसारित करने को ही वे संघ की सेवा समझते हैं। संघ एवं स्वयं के हितों में विभेद उन्हें समझ ही नहीं आ रहा है। हम सभी सदस्यों को ऐसे तत्वों से सावधान रहने की आवश्यकता है।

बैंकिंग कार्यकलाप में आजकल एक विरोधाभास देखने में आ रहा है। अभी कुछ दिनों पहले तक हम शाखाओं में यह प्रयत्न कर रहे थे कि अधिकाधिक संख्या में ए० टी० एम० कार्य के प्रयोग को बढ़ाया जाये ताकि शाखाओं के परिसर में भीड़ कम हो। इंटरनेट बैंकिंग का प्रसार भी इसी दिशा में प्रयास था पर आज इसका उल्टा हो रहा है। अब हम इस बात के लिये अपनी शाखाओं को पुरस्कृत कर रहे हैं कि वे ज्यादा से ज्यादा अपने ए० टी० एम० कार्ड धारकों को शाखा परिसर के अन्दर आकर ग्रीन चैनल काउन्टर के प्रयोग से बढ़ावा दे। यह विदित हो कि ग्रीन चैनल काउन्टर के प्रयोग के लिये ग्राहकों के पास ए० टी० एम० कार्ड को होना अनिवार्य है। इस प्रकार हम अपने पूर्व प्रयासों को ही उलटने का उपक्रम कर रहे हैं। आशा करता हूँ, प्रबन्धन इस विषय को गंभीरता को समझेगा।

इसी प्रकार एक और अजीब प्रथा हमारे मंडल के चल पड़ी है। कोई भी आधिकारिक बैठक में आप भाग लें, उसमें चर्चा Staff accountability पर आकर रूक जाती है। कोई भी बैठक बिना धमकी के पूरी ही नहीं होती कि अधिकारी यह या वह करें अन्यथा उसपर कार्यवाही की जायेगी। अधिकारियों की सीमाओं एवं उनकी परेशानियों को सुनने और जानने को कोई तैयार नहीं है। पता नहीं क्यों हम यह मान बैठे हैं कि डरा-धमका कर ही काम निकाला जा सकता है। मेरे विचार से यह कुशल प्रबन्धन के नियमों एवं सिद्धांतों के विपरीत है।

जल्दी ही Cricle Negotiating Council की बैठक होने वाली है जहाँ कई बिन्दुओं पर विचार किया जायेगा। अगर आपके पास भी कोई बात हो जिसे आप सदस्यों के आम हित में प्रबन्धन तक पहुँचाना चाहते हैं तो केन्द्रीय समिति को अवश्य बतायें। हमें आपके सुझावों का इन्तजार रहेगा तबतक के लिये शुभ विदा और

अपने पासवर्ड का ख्याल रखिये, इसी में आपकी और बैंक की सुरक्षा है।

SUCCESS COMES TO THOSE WHO DARE AND ACT

TAKING CHARGE AS A BRANCH MANAGER

(Please go through our branch latest RFIA report before taking over so that you can have an idea about the irregularities pertaining to the branch.)

1. Balancing : The checking of the BGL accounts/Loan Balance File/CCOD File give an overall feel of the branch. The balancing position as reported in the Branch Manager's Monthly Certificate is checked with the respective periodical balancing books.

2. Currency Chest and Small Coin Depot : The Branch Cash Balance should be thoroughly checked i.e. all items, including joint custody portion of uncurrent coins. It is verified by referring to the Cash Officers' Hand Balance Book to see if -- The Accountant/Branch Manager is in the habit of verifying two items under currency notes and two items of coins DAILY and all items once during every WEEK.

3. Documents held at the Branch in respect of Overdrafts, Demand and Term Loans, Cash Credit Advances and Protested Bills, Recalled Debts, Merchandise under lien to the Bank. Where the relative advances are in the charge of other authorized officials, all documents at the branch in respect of Overdrafts, Demand Loans, Term Loans and Cash Credit Advances since the last Inspection and Audit and all documents in respect of irregular accounts and protested bills should be examined and checked with the relative registers by the relieving Branch Manager. **Otherwise all the documents should be taken over individually.**

4. Branch Documents : All items are to be checked to ensure that they are all valid, indexed as laid down and no extraneous documents are entered.

5. Miscellaneous Articles in Safe Deposit : Receipts in respect of deliveries made since last Inspection and Audit should be verified. The verification should also cover the aspects such as packing, seals, condition, etc.

6. Keys and duplicate keys of the Branch.

7. Office and House furniture etc. : Full verification has to be made to see that they are

indexed, entered and item-wise serially numbered. Obsolete and missing items should be identified and noted as such, in the respective registers/certificates.

8. Trust Accounts : Documents relating to Trust accounts and instructions on record to be verified only where no separate Manager of a Division is looking after these accounts.

9. Miscellaneous Areas :

- (i) **Budgets :** Relieving Branch Manager should discuss thoroughly the Budget of the current year with the out-going Branch Manager and familiarize himself with the underlying assumptions and potential. He should also scrutinize the Branch Dossier.
- ii) **Customer Contact :** Before departure of the out-going Branch Manager, the relieving Branch Manager should get himself introduced to important constituents and other local dignitaries.
 - i) Protective Arrangements: Relieving Branch Manager should satisfy himself that all current instructions regarding protective arrangements are complied with.
 - ii) Inspection & Audit Reports
 - iii) Annual Maintenance Contracts

10. Administration : Spend some time in the different sections/departments to ensure and satisfy that the operative instructions as laid down, are generally followed. Get a feel of the branch; Delegation; Reporting Systems; Budget and Performance; Tasks on hand; Preventive System; Protective Arrangements. Familiarize with: Credit Plans, Customers and Complaints, Fraud and Disciplinary cases, if any; Branch Culture; Staff Orientation. Where Accountant is not there BM has to take over all the items specified for Accountant. At the end of the taking over submit to Controlling Authority a Relieving Branch Manager's Certificate on the standard format. .

मोबाइल बनाम ग्राहक सेवा

रात के आठ बज चुके थे। पर अभी तक शाखा में मोबाइल सेवा बंद नहीं हुई थी। कभी आर.एम्. का तो कभी एल.एच.ओ. से फोन आने का सिलसिला चालू था। जेनरटर वाला बार-बार तेल खत्म होने की आशंका जताकर चला जाता। मोबाइल की घंटी से तंग आकर मैंने कैंटीन बॉय को शाखा परिसर बंद करने को कहा।

शाखा बंद कर मैं कैंटीन बॉय को अपने साथ मोटरसाइकिल पर लेकर घर की ओर चल पड़ा। मेरा घर शाखा से 30 कि.मी. दूर स्थित था। रास्ते में मैंने अपने कैंटीन बॉय को उसके घर पहुंचाया। और स्वयं आगे बढ़ गया। रास्ते में अँधेरा छाया था। सड़क जंगल के बीच से गुजरती थी। भगवान का नाम लेकर प्रतिदिन की तरह आगे बढ़ता जा रहा था। इतने में जेब में रखी मोबाइल की घंटी बजी। सोचा कि घरवाली का फाने होगा। अपनी बाईक रोकी। जेब से मोबाइल निकाला तो पाया जोनल ऑफिस से फोन है। मैंने सहमते हुए फोन को कान में लगाया। एन.पी.ए. कम करने की धमकी भरा फोन था। मैं भी झूठा आश्वासन देकर मोटरसाइकिल स्टार्ट कर आगे बढ़ गया।

अरे ये क्या? आगे बंदूक लेकर कुछ लोग सड़क पर खड़े थे। उन्होंने मुझे रोका तथा पूछ-ताछ शुरू कर दी। एक ने मेरी छाती पर बंदूक तानकर कहा-“अरे रात में किसको मेरी खबर पहुंचा रहा था।” एक ने कहा-“लगता है यह पुलिस का खबरी है।” उसमें से एक ने मेरी जेब से मोबाइल ले लिया। एक मेरी आँखों पर पट्टी बांधी और दूसरे ने मेरा हाथ बांध दिया। उसके बाद लोगों ने मुझे पैदल जंगल में ले गए। एक घंटे तक पैदल चलने के बाद जब मेरी आँख की पट्टी खोली गई तो पता चला कि मैं नक्सलियों के कब्जे में हूँ। मैंने अपना परिचय एक शाखा प्रबंधक के रूप में दी। लेकिन वो मानने से इंकार करते रहे। उस रात मुझे भोजन कराया गया और एक चारपाई पर बाँधकर दो बन्दूकधारी के पहरे में आराम करने को कहा गया। मैं रात भर अपने परिवार वालों की चिंता में करवट बदलता रहा। कब आँख लग गई पता नहीं।

आँख खुली तो देखा कि सूर्य की रौशनी अँधेरे को

चिरते हुए मेरे चारों तरफ फैल चुकी थी। नक्सली मेरी शाखा के आसपास वाले गाँव से बैंक से ग्राहकों को लाने की व्यवस्था में लगे हुए थे। वो उन लोगों से मेरी पहचान करवाना चाहते थे। तीन-चार ग्राहक को जंगल में लाया गया, पर सभी ने मुझे एक बैंकर के रूप में पहचानने में अपनी असमर्थता जताई। उनका कहना था कि वो लोग शाखा में अब नहीं जाते, उनका काम तो ए.टी.एम्. से ही हो जाता है। उनके न पहचानने पर मैं घबरा गया और कुछ क्षण के लिए ऐसा लगा कि मैं अपनी मौत को स्पष्ट देख रहा हूँ। मेरे चारों ओर लोगों की तायदाद बढ़ने लगी। सभी लोग मुझे ऐसा घूर रहे थे जैसे मैं उनका अपराधी था।

इतने में एक बूढ़ा आदमी भीड़ से निकलकर नक्सली सरदार के पास आया तथा सरदार के काम में कुछ बुदबुदाया। सरदार अपनी बंदूक लेकर मेरी ओर बढ़ा। मेरी सांस अटकी हुई थी। सरदार ने मुझसे पूछा कि इस शाखा से पहले तुम्हारी पोस्टिंग कहाँ थी। मैंने बताया-“इससे पहले मैं कमरू शाखा में शाखाप्रबंधक था।” सरदार उस बूढ़े आदमी की तरफ इंगित कर पूछा-“इन्हें पहचानते हो?” मेरा उत्तर था-“याद नहीं।” बूढ़े ने कहा-“साहब, आप दस साल पहले मेरी बच्ची की शादी के वक्त शाखा में काफी मदद की थी। आप ही की कृपा से मेरी बच्ची की शादी हो पाई थी।” मैंने तुरंत कहा-“बाबा, मैंने कुछ नहीं किया वो मेरा कर्तव्य था। ग्राहक सेवा ही बैंकर का धर्म है” सरदार मेरे उत्तर से संतुष्ट हुआ। तत्पश्चात नक्सलियों ने मुझे रिहा कर जंगल से दूर एक सड़क पर मोटरसाइकिल के साथ छोड़ दिया।

मैं भगवान का लाख-लाख शुक्रिया अदाकर घर की ओर चल पड़ा। कल की घटना की समीक्षा करते हुए मैंने सोचा कि मोबाइल सेवा की वजह से मुझे इतनी यातना सहनी पड़ी पर मेरी जान ग्राहक सेवा की वजह से बची। फिर हम क्यों ग्राहक को शाखा से दूर रखना चाहते हैं। समाज में बैंकर की पहचान ग्राहक से ही हो सकती है मोबाइल से नहीं।

////// GALLSTONES : FREQUENTLY ASKED QUESTIONS ANSWERED ////

Important for digesting food in the intestine, particularly fat. Gallstones are common; they occur in approximately 20% of women.

Gender : Gallstones occur more commonly in women than men. :

Age : Gallstone prevalence increases with age.

Obesity : Obese individuals are more likely to form gallstones than thin individuals.

Pregnancy : Pregnancy increases the risk for cholesterol gallstones because during pregnancy, bile contains more cholesterol, and the gallbladder does not contract normally.

Birth Control pill and hormone therapy increased levels of hormones caused by either treatment mimics pregnancy.

Crohn's disease : Individuals with Crohn's disease of the terminal ileum are more likely to develop gallstones. Gallstones form because patients with Crohn's disease lack enough bile acids to solubilize the cholesterol in bile. Normally, bile acids that enter the small intestine from the liver and gallbladder are absorbed back into the body in the terminal ileum and are secreted again by the liver into bile. In other words, the bile acids recycle. In Crohn's disease, the terminal ileum is diseased. Bile acids are not absorbed normally, the body becomes depleted of bile acids, and less bile acids are secreted in bile. As a result there is not enough bile adds to keep cholesterol dissolved in bile, resulting in gallstone formation.

What are the symptoms of gallstones?

The majority of people with gallstones have no signs or symptoms and are unaware of their gallstones. (The gallstones are "silent.") The

gallstones often are found as a result of tests (for example, ultrasound or X-ray examination of the abdomen) performed while evaluating medical conditions other than gallstones. Symptoms can appear later in life, however, after many years without symptoms.

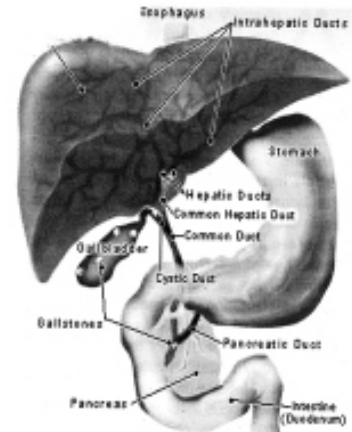
Thus, over a period of five years, approximately 10% of people with silent gallstones will develop symptoms. Once symptoms develop, they are likely to continue and often will worsen.

Gallstones are blamed for many symptoms they do not cause.

TREATMENT

Cholecystectomy (removal of the gallbladder surgically) is the standard treatment for gallstones in the gallbladder. Surgery may be done through a large abdominal incision or laparoscopically through small punctures of the abdominal wall. Laparoscopic surgery results in less pain and a faster recovery. Cholecystectomy has a low rate of complications, but serious complications such as damage to the bile ducts and leakage of bile occasionally occur. There also is risk associated with the general anesthesia that is necessary for either type of surgery. Problems following removal of the gallbladder are few. Digestion of food is not affected, and no change in diet is necessary. Chronic diarrhea occurs in approximately 10% of patients.

RESTORATION OF PQP AND FPP IN THE PENSION FORMULA

We quote hereunder the text of AISBOF Circular No.75 dt. 11.08.2011 on the captioned subject, the contents of which are self-explicit.

TEXT

"Our members are aware that, at the time of revision of Pension in our Bank, w.e.f. 01.11.2007, the Govt. of India had unilaterally altered the formula by withdrawing Professional Qualification Pay (PQP) and Fixed Personal Pay (FPP), without assigning any reason. We strongly

objected to the tinkering of the pension formula and communicated to the Management to take up the issue with the Government of India for restoration of the PQP & FPP in the formula. At one stage, our representative in the Central Board objected to the amendments to the Pension Regulations for 9th bipartite retirees, without PQP & FPP component. Only after an assurance from the Management that, they will follow-up with the Govt. for restoration of PQP & FPP in the pension formula the, amendments to pension regulations was permitted.

2. Both the Federations continued to pursue the issue with the Management and at Govt. level. We are glad that the Govt. has restored the PQP & FPP in pension formula and accordingly, following will be the pension formula w.e.f. 01.11.2007.

i) Basic Pay upto Rs. 31,500/- p.m.	50% of the average B.P. +½ of PQP + ½ of FPP
ii) Basic Pay above	40% of average Basic pay + ½ of PQP + ½ of FPP (Subject to minimum of Rs. 15,730/-) +½ PQP + ½ PPP

3. Comrades, we congratulate and compliment each one of you for your patience. We thank the Management functionaries for continued follow-up with the Government of India in rendering justice to the 9th bipartite retirees. We have the responsibility of achieving other improvements to pension scheme in our Bank, sum as revision of pension-; to 7th bipartite retirees, Revision of Family Pension, Commutation formula, D.A neutralization to earlier retirees etc., apart from achieving 50% of the last drawn pay as pension, without ceiling and updation of Pension as in the case of Central Govt. employees. The Steering Committee of both the Federations will meet shortly to chalk out strategy to achieve the long pending issue of improvements to superannuation benefits.

4. The necessary amendments to the pension Regulations will be passed in the Executive Committee of Central Board meeting shortly to give effect to the revised formula.

5. Affiliates/members are requested to take note of the revised pension formula.."

"The monetary ceilings on reimbursement of cleansing material to the residential accommodation for maintenance and upkeep of premises and Bank's Furniture and fixtures, were last revised w.e.f 01.06.2007. Due to inflation, the rates of cleansing material have gone up. 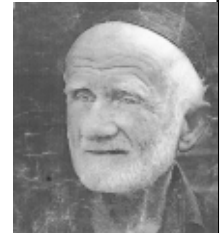

बैंकों में आज ठप रहेंगे काम, मांगें नहीं माने जाने पर यूनाइटेड फोरम ऑफ बैंक यूनियन्स की चेतावनी

बेमियादी हड़ताल पर जा सकते हैं बैंककर्मों

शुक्रवार की एक दिवसीय हड़ताल के बाद मांगें नहीं माने जाने पर बैंककर्मियों ने बेमियादी हड़ताल की धमकी दी है। बैंककर्मियों का कहना है कि बैंकों में सुधार के नाम पर केंद्र सरकार के प्रस्तावित कदम का पूरे देश की अर्थव्यवस्था पर बुरा असर पड़ेगा। उधर, बैंकों ने अपनी मांगों के समर्थन में गुरुवार को एक रैली निकाली। राजधानी के फेजर रोड से शुरू हुई रैली कारगिल चौक पर समाप्त हुई।

रैली को यूनाइटेड फोरम ऑफ बैंक यूनियन्स के नेताओं ने संबोधित किया। वक्ताओं ने कहा कि बैंकिंग सेक्टर में असौमिचित विदेशी पूंजी निवेश की अनुमति सरकार के लिए आत्मघाती कदम होगी। बैंक यूनियनों ने बैंकिंग रेगुलेशन एक्ट में किसी बदलाव का विरोध किया है। निजी क्षेत्र के बैंकों में वोटिंग राइट को दस फीसदी से बढ़ाकर असौमिचित करने और सार्वजनिक क्षेत्र के बैंकों में वोटिंग राइट को एक फीसदी से बढ़ाकर दस फीसदी करने की योजना पर विरोध करते

हुए यूनियन का कहना है कि ऐसा करना देश की आर्थिक स्थिति के साथ खिलवाड़ करना होगा।
